


## Germany shooting video

An armed assailant tried to make his way to a synagogue in eastern Germany on the holiest day of Judaism, and two people were killed when he fired near a building and a kebab shop, authorities and witnesses said. The attacker shot at the door of a synagogue in the town of Halle, but did not enter as 70-80 people inside were watching the holy day, a local Jewish leader said. A video of the attack was broadcast live on streaming site Twitch, which said it was working urgently to remove it. Witnesses told German media that they saw a man open fire in camouflage before fleeing in a car. Police in Halle later tweeted that they had detained one person in connection with the attack. They did not specify whether they were looking for any additional suspects. German Interior Minister Horst Seehofer said On Wednesday that the shooting was anti-Semitic and said federal prosecutors who are investigating believe it could be an attack by right-wing extremists, Reuters reported. Based on the current information, we must assume that this was at least an anti-Semitic attack. According to the federal prosecutor's office, there are enough indications that this may have been a right-wing extremist motive. At first they urged residents to stay at home, and the city's train station was closed. Hours later, police said there was no longer an acute danger to the public and residents could return to the streets. They did not specify why the assessment had changed, but the dpa news agency and Bild newspaper cited unidentified security sources, saying the evidence pointed to a lone attacker. Police have not confirmed that the attack was directed against worshippers, but Jews around the world on Wednesday are celebrating the Yom Kippur, the holiest day in the Jewish calendar, and part of the duct tape-filled crime scene was just outside the walls of a Jewish cemetery adjacent to the Halle Synagogue. Ten Americans were reportedly inside the synagogue at the time of the attack, and all were safe and sound, U.S. Ambassador to Germany Richard Grenell said on Twitter. According to SITE Intelligence Group, a U.S. company that tracks online activity of white supremacists and jihadist groups, 35 minutes of video footage was posted online that captured all of the shootings and subsequent events. The attacker shouted in English: The root of all the problems of the Jews! Before the shooting, according to SITE. The attacker also claimed to be a Holocaust denier and denounced feminism, according to SITE, and showed stocks of weapons, and explosive devices. The video then followed the assailant shot and killed a woman in the street after he failed to enter the synagogue, then entered a kebab shop and killed another man before fleeing. A spokesman for Twitch, Amazon's video game platform, said the company was shocked and saddened by the tragedy that occurred in Germany today and expressed condolences to the victims. Twitch has a zero-tolerance policy against hate speech, and any act of violence is taken extremely seriously, the company said in a statement obtained by CBS News. We have worked urgently to remove this content and will permanently suspend any accounts found to post or repost the contents of this heinous act. Twitch later said on Twitter the live video was viewed by five people and a recorded version of the video was viewed by about 2,200 people for half an hour before it was tagged and deleted. Downloaded versions, however, have been shared by far-right online groups, according to SITE. Twitch said it has taken steps to help prevent the distribution of the video. The shooting attack on Wednesday echoed yet another gruesome shooting midway around the world when a far-right white supremacist in March killed 51 people at two mosques in Christchurch, New York and livestreamed much of the attack on Facebook. The massacre drew sharp criticism from social media giants for not immediately finding or blocking such a violent video. Anti-Semitic attacks in Germany 02:27 A witness told local television that he first heard a huge explosion before he saw someone try to enter a Jewish cemetery. He fired a shotgun several times at the cemetery, at the door. Then came the woman who was shot, she just happened to come from the tram stop, the witness said. The head of the Halle Jewish community, Max Privorotsky, told German news magazine Der Spiegel that a camera at the entrance to the synagogue showed a man trying to break into the building. The assailant fired several shots at the door and threw several Molotov cocktails, firecrackers or grenades to check on him, he said. But the door remained closed - God protected us. It all lasted maybe five to 10 minutes. According to Privorocoy, 70 or 80 people were in the synagogue at the time of the shooting. A witness interviewed by n-tv said he was in a kebab shop when a man wearing a helmet and military jacket threw something resembling a grenade that bounced off the door frame. Conrad Roessler said the man then shot at the store at least once. All the customers next to me ran, of course I did too - I think there were five or six of us out there, Roessler said. The man behind me probably died. I hid in the toilet, he said. Others were looking for a back entrance. I didn't know if he was. I quietly locked myself in this toilet and wrote to my family that I loved them and waited for something to happen. Then I went to the store. he said. German federal prosecutors, who are always dealing with cases involving Terrorism or national security has taken over the investigation into the Halle shooting, German news agency dpa reported. CBS News correspondent Mark Phillips said German authorities have stepped up security around synagogues and Jewish cemeteries across the country after the shooting. Together with you, I would like to express my sympathy to the German police forces, the German people and the German Jewish community, European Parliament President David Sassoli told a crowd in Brussels on Wednesday. Our thoughts are with the families and friends of the victims and German citizens. Police said shots were also fired Wednesday in Landsberg, about 15 kilometers (nearly 10 miles) from Halle, but it was not clear whether the two shootings were related. Hours later, dozens of police vans and a helicopter were seen on the outskirts of the small town. The European Parliament held a minute's silence at the start of its session on Wednesday to mark the unfolding situation in Halle. As CBS News correspondent Roxanne Saberi reported last year that the marked rise of extreme nationalist groups in Germany has also brought the return of anti-Semitic acts. German police received more than 400 reports of anti-Semitic attacks in the first half of 2018 - a 10% increase over the same period last year. Shots fired at a synagogue at a reconciliation festival in Yoko Kipura will be shot in the heart, German Foreign Minister Heiko Maas wrote on Twitter. We must all act against anti-Semitism in our country. A gunman has killed nine people in two apparently racially motivated shootings at hookah bars in the German city of Hanau, police said. The suspect then killed himself, police said, after killing his mother in his home. Investigators believed a racist motive was behind the attack, said Peter Beth, hessen's interior minister. Angela Merkel said the circumstances of the attack should be fully investigated, and the shooting exposed the poison of racism in German society. She promised to stand up to those who seek to divide the country. Nine people were killed in attacks on two bars on Wednesday night. Five others suffered life-threatening injuries, police said. Some of those killed were of Turkish origin, a spokesman for the Turkish president said. We expect the German authorities to make every effort to educate them on this case. Racism is a collective cancer, Ibrahim Kalon tweeted. The killer was named by police as 43-year-old Tobias R. His last name was not given, according to German practice. The Newspaper Bild reported that the militant expressed far-right views in a letter with Left. The video, in which he explained his motives, is believed to be part of the investigation. The Guardian could not confirm the details of its confession. The video was taken from social media on Thursday morning, police said. After the killing, a huge manhunt was launched for the gunman involving dozens of armed police and a helicopter hovering over a suburban town 15 miles (25 km) east of Frankfurt. Around 5 a.m. local time, police tweeted that SWAT officers broke into the suspect's home and found him dead along with another body. There is currently no sign of any other offenders, police said in a statement. Footage shows the aftermath of the deadly hookah bar attack in Germany - video officers sealed and searched the terrace of a house in the Kesselstadt Hanau area, not far from the scene of one of the shootings, following subsequent witness accounts of the car's escape. According to local media, eight or nine shots were fired at the Midnight shisha bar in Hoymarkt in the city centre around 10 p.m. A dark car was seen leaving the scene. Shortly thereafter, shots were fired at the second hookah bar, the Arena bar and cafe in Kurt Schumacher Platz in the western district of Kesselstadt. Police have denied initial reports of a third incident in the Lamboy area. They called on all witnesses with mobile phone footage to upload it to the police website and urged them not to post evidence on social media. Michael Malkmus, a spokesman for Hessen Police, said locals helped police track down the alleged gunman after seeing his car parked in the street. We came to the building after calls from people who saw the car. We identified his license plate and compared him to his house. We sealed the area and then entered the house. Neighbors said they heard a huge explosion when police used explosives to break down the door at 3 a.m. Map federal prosecutors said Thursday they are taking responsibility for investigating the shooting amid reports that the suspect may have had a far-right motive. Merkel promised that everything would be done to investigate the circumstances of these terrible murders. She added: 'Racism is poison. Hatred is poison. This hatred exists in our society and it is responsible for too many crimes. Hanau federal MP Katya Lakert, in a tweet, called the attack a terrible scenario in which she expressed her heartfelt condolences to the victims. The city's mayor, Klaus Kaminsky, said it was the worst night imaginable. Hanau has a population of about 100,000 people. He left a message to tell me he was injured, a man who has not been identified, NTV said. I called him immediately. He told me he was in the ambulance. He had a bullet in his shoulder. Another witness, who knew some of the victims, said: These are people we have known for years. It's like in a movie. That this happened is unimaginable. That there are people who are so heartless when shooting at others who have done nothing wrong. Other witnesses described the discovery of empty bullet casings scattered on the ground near one of the cafes. This article was amended on February 27, 2020.
